Luke 23:33-43

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" Bill Helin - Artist, Illustrator, writer

Helin, a member of the Tsimshian Nation, has created art since he was three. His traditional Tsimshian wood carvings, jewelry and paintings are shaped by the many hours he spent listening to his grandmother as she told him many legends. In addition, he has written and illustrated children's books about the Tsimshian people. He designed uniform patches for the space shuttle Columbia (2006) and the International Space Station astronauts (2011). A signed engraved silver bracelet of his is for sale in the Thrift Store.
